Curriculum news

Cubs Class

This week in the Cubs class we have been writing up our final versions of lost and found and working on our sentence building. In maths we have been making number bonds to ten and twenty. We have finished our scale pictures of Antarctic penguins and thought about the explorations of Captain Scott. We have also enjoyed practising our songs for the Nativity.

Pups Class

This week has been another busy one for the Pups class. We have been busy in English writing our information texts about a famous astronaut and have learnt more about using conjunctions and capital letters accurately to edit and improve our pieces. We have been using rulers in maths to measure to the nearest centimetre, half centimetre and millimetre and will begin to look at calculating the perimeter of a 2D shape. In the afternoons, we began our information posters, choosing to focus on either Galileo Galilei or Isaac Newton. We learnt the name of many familiar animals in French and are beginning to join the components of our Christmas stockings in D&T.

Wolves Class

In the Wolves we have been producing Christmas decorations for our Enterprise week on Monday 11th December. We have been creating all sorts of exciting things in class and with Mrs Marshall. In science this week we have been learning about irreversible changes and we even made our own type of plastic. In French we have started to learn Christmas phrases and we have created our own 12 days of Christmas advent calendar that we will open each day. As well as all of this we have been African drumming, programming computer games where you are chased and we have been researching Scandinavian clothing and patterns. Our islands have also been used this week as the inhabitants have had to make decisions about farming to feed their people.

In the Fox class we have been writing persuasive letters to the Grinch to stop him from stealing Christmas. We have also started to learn a text about a rabbit that is persuading a wolf to become a vegetarian. In maths we have been learning about fractions.
